

Mario Castillo has spent the last fifteen years working in projects related to economic development and new technologies. He is currently the Chief of the Unit of Innovation and New Technologies in the Division of Production, Productivity and Management at the United Nations Economic Commission for Latin America and the Caribbean (ECLAC). He previously served as the coordinator of the ECLAC @LIS2 project, an initiative co-funded by the European Commission and executed by ECLAC that focused on dialogue for the information society in Latin America.

Mr. Castillo has recognized expertise in the design and management of public policies in the areas of technological innovation both in Chile and abroad. He has served as the Director of the Chilean Technology Office in Silicon Valley in California, Head of Investment and Development at the Chilean Economic Development Agency (CORFO), board member of the InnovaChile committee which is the main Chilean fund that promotes research, development and innovation, and Executive Secretary of the Public-Private Coalition for the Global Services industry, one of the four clusters prioritized by the National Council for Innovation in Chile. He has served as a board member of the Euro Chile Foundation as well as the Chile-Sweden Technology Fund, and also as an international consultant on issues of globalization and new technology participating in projects with Duke University and the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB).

He holds an industrial engineering degree from the University of Chile as well as a master's degree in Business Administration (MBA) from Loyola College (Maryland) and International Management (MIM) from the Thunderbird School of Global Management in the United States.
